What is a T Level?

Developed in collaboration with employers, T Levels offer students a recognised technical qualification which is **equivalent to three A levels** and attracts the same number of UCAS points.

The combination of classroom learning (80%) and a 9-week industry placement (20%) creates a unique opportunity for students to study whilst gaining the knowledge and skills businesses need.

At the end of the two-year programme, a T Level can lead to an entry-level skilled job, a higher apprenticeship or further study, including at university.

Heroes of the Pandemic

A series to celebrate jobs we sometimes take for granted, but have played a heroic role throughout the coronavirus pandemic

Retail Assistants

One of the top priorities during the pandemic has been ensuring the availability of essential products in our supermarkets and shops. At times the fear of not being able to get certain items has resulted in panic buying and rationing of some products. Retail assistants have managed this public anxiety whilst doing their 'normal' day-to-day work. These heroes have literally kept food on our tables and provided us with the essential products needed to safely live our lives.

Key information about this job

- Although the retail workforce overall is projected to decline by 51,000, the huge number of older staff due to retire will create nearly 800,000 vacancies by 2027 (LMI for All)
- The average salary for this role is around £17,000 per year

Aspirations

Within the retail sector, supermarkets have seen substantial growth in recent years. The 'big four' of Asda, Morrisons, Sainsbury's and Tesco have been joined by increasingly popular brands like Aldi and Lidl. All offer excellent training in a wide range of job roles from retail assistants to area managers and warehouse operatives to engineers. Their apprenticeship and graduate management schemes are very highly regarded- definitely worth a closer look!
