In Science, the children have really enjoyed learning about different states of matter and have been using their investigative skills to explore key questions such as, 'If you are

In computing, the children have very much enjoyed learning about computer networks and have particularly enjoyed learning what the internet is and exploring some of the websites, and the wealth of information, that they have to offer. Well done, Leopards! What a fabulous first term you have had!

Elephants

What a jam-packed half term we have had in the Elephants! Over the past several weeks, we have been deepening our understanding of the four operations in Maths (including some competitive times tables on TT Rockstars), continuing to read and enjoy a variety of texts in reading and extend our writing with our novel study book 'Jumanji'. As we came to the end of our novel study, the children enjoyed our film afternoon watching the original 1995 version of Jumanji (arguably the best). During this half term the Elephants have focused on learning all about how we can be more sustainable in our Geography lessons taking walks around school to observe how sustainable we currently are and how we can develop our sustainability. In DT, the children enjoyed creating their own money container - the sewing lessons were very interesting. Within our PE lessons, the children

loved their dance sessions with a specialist teacher, learning different moves inspired from our book Jumanji. We have been developing our understanding of being unique in our PSHE lessons and that we should inspire individuals to do what makes them happy.
