We use PE and sports premium to:

- build capacity and capability in the school and make sure that improvements made to the quality of PE, sport and physical activity provision are sustainable and will benefit pupils joining the school in future
- develop or add to the PE, sport and physical activity that the school provides

We continue to develop children's enjoyment and involvement in sport and physical activity from an early age. Due to continued emphasis and research surrounding childhood obesity and well-being we continue to provide opportunities to improve children's stamina and enjoyment of physical activities to support well-being throughout our curriculum and develop children's enjoyment of a healthy lifestyle. The school's governing body continue to be kept closely informed over the issue of PE and sports premium and how the school has used the money. The governors continue to triangulate evidence provided by the Headteacher and PE Lead.

How much PE and Sports Premium has Kingsclere CE Primary School received for the year 2023 - 2024?

For the financial year 2023 - 2024 Kingsclere CE Primary School has received £17,878

Rationale for Allocation

Our allocation of the PE and sports premium grant is based upon detailed research into how best to use the money for the greatest impact on pupils. We recognise the value of PE and school sport on promoting healthy lifestyles and the benefits to pupil's wider achievement in school.

- To improve the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- To increase staff confidence, knowledge and skills in planning and teaching PE
- To broaden the range of sports and activities available to pupils

Evaluation and Impact of Sports Premium Spending 2022 - 2023

- All pupils receive 2 x weekly PE sessions using PE Hub planning. Children are being exposed to a range of sports and skill development. Progression of skills are evident through learning walks and the quality of PE teaching is good
- Staff conferencing shows that staff confidence has improved delivering PE lessons using PE Hub planning and resources. As a result of the detailed guidance from the PE Hub programme in gymnastics, staff agreed that additional training was not required for gymnastics teaching
- Staff Career Professional Development in PE has supported teaching and learning, including PE Conference for PE Leadership
- PE adequately resourced with new equipment to match the PE hub planning. This has included new gymnastics equipment and netball posts and netballs
- Maths on the Move led by ActiveMe360 has enabled children to make good progress from their baseline level assessments
- Active Me 360 – pupil conferencing has reported higher engagement in lessons due to specialist coaches, e.g., ex-England rugby player coached children in rugby lessons
- 120 children took part in inter-school competition including a range of sports as well as participation fixtures and competitive fixtures
- Sports Week – pupil conferencing shows that children enjoyed trying out sports that they would not usually try, including cricket and new dance styles which has seen an increase of pupils in extra-curricular activities, e.g., dance club has increased from 8 to 25 pupils over the academic year
- All children, including children in early years, KS1 and KS2 received the equivalent of 7.5 hours swim teaching in the Summer Term. As a result, all children at Kingsclere CE Primary School have access to improving their water safety and swimming proficiency
- Resources to encourage physical activity at breaktime and lunch, e.g., Skip2BFit, balls, cricket resources, badminton nets etc.
